


Iota Omicron Initiates Eta Mu Pledge Class

Leaders On Campus



Greetings from Iota Omicron! I am writing to invite you to come and celebrate homecoming with us. The week of homecoming will be October 16-21. This year we are doing homecoming with Delta Zeta and Alpha Gamma Rho. The game starts on Saturday at 1:30, so come early to attend our 9:00 a.m. tailgating.

We also will be having a brotherhood football game and barbecue on Sunday October 22. So make sure you break out the old high school cleats and tell the wife and kids you'll be home a little later on Sunday night.

I am also writing to announce the kick-off of our 20+1 program. The goal of this program is to start raising money for a new house. As you probably already know, we have 72 members in our chapter. This is one of the largest chapters on campus, and we are still growing. The only problem is that our facilities aren't the best. We have been maintaining the chapter house, with recent renovations to the bathroom and by re-modeling the kitchen, but the house will not last another ten years.

The 20+1 program will be a once a semester fundraiser, and will hopefully spark the interest of all of you. Our fundraising chair will contact you once a semester and ask for a minimum of 20 plus 1 dollar donation. It will be 20 dollars plus 1 dollar for every year you've graduated. For instance, if you've graduated in 1992, you will be asked for \$23.

This money raised will then be put in a bank account which will not be drawn out of for at least 5 years. The key to help us reach our goal, is to save! We will not touch this money until the year 2000. I feel this is important, because we are serious about this program, and want you to know exactly where your money is going.
